

## ■ CTAO Toronto Trucker Strike

Dear Customer,

Container Trucking Association of Ontario (CTAO) began a campaign in Toronto on Tuesday which saw a withdrawal of services by their membership. This action is being undertaken in an effort to increase their level of compensation from their employers. While all facilities in Toronto, including the railways, remain open to the trucking community, those truckers who continue to work have been met with threats of violence in an attempt to intimidate them and as such many non-members have ceased dray services.

As a direct result of this job action, our rail partner has advised Hapag-Lloyd that they can no longer accept imports with final destination Toronto. We strongly encourage our customers to make alternate arrangements, on the account of the cargo, to move their containers from the ports of Montreal and Vancouver to Toronto. Failure to do so may result in longer than normal delays.

We will provide updates as more information becomes available.
